



From Scribe to Stage

International Audience Engagement Workshop

Radovljica, 21 and 22 August 2024

The two-day workshop is conceived in three parts. The event will be introduced by theoretical and practical presentation of various types of early music sources and ways of transforming them to music editions for present-day performers. In the continuation the work will focus on two examples from the turn of the 17th century revolving around music heritage of the now Slovenian coastal town of Koper/Capodistria and originating from two different church traditions of the time: plainchant tradition and sacred music composed or copied by Antonio Tarsia (1643–1722), a local musician at Koper Cathedral. The participants will engage with musicians preparing the concerts on 22 and 25 August dedicated to these repertories. Active participants will work with Domen Marinčič on selected works by Antonio Tarsia, and with Katarina Šter on plainchant traditions. The final part of the workshop will consist of a discussion on how to reach important stakeholders and involve with cultural tourism. Presented will be results of a previous research (led by Dr Frans Brouwer with his students at the Erasmus University Rotterdam) on how can early music heritage be disseminated to a larger target group within and beyond the existing niche audience.

Registration for participants is compulsory.

The official language of the event is English.

The event is organised by the Research Centre of the Slovenian Academy of Sciences and Arts, Institute of Musicology (within the research programme ARIS P6-0004: *Researches in the History of Music in Slovenia*: and the COST EarlyMuse project) and the Radovljica Festival.
